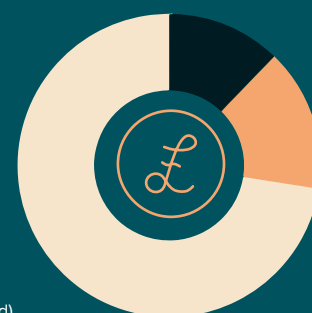

Challenge

Morley College have a range of excellent courses available for entrepreneurs that they want to promote to London’s small businesses such as Business Strategy Communication and Relationship Management or Accounting Principles and Project Management.

Solution

The college registered with Grow London Local, and courses are now available via the Grow London Local digital platform so entrepreneurs can browse and register themselves. Business Support Managers are also referring entrepreneurs to the college’s courses to develop their leadership and management skills in business.

Impact

The partnership with Grow London Local is helping Morley College to reach more of London’s SMEs, leading to more enrolments.
